Dear Valued Customer,

Quail Valley Golf Club is now closed, effective immediately.

Over the past week and a half, we have tried to keep our doors open. The Governor mandated a shutdown last Monday that wasn't a mandate but only a suggestion. Then he mandated a shutdown late Thursday afternoon but delayed enforcement until 12:01 am Saturday. Late Friday night he extended the enforcement of the shutdown until 8:00 am Monday morning. This is why you received those emails indicating we were open, closed, open, closed.

Like many golf courses, I requested a waiver last week and copied my state representative. After talking with him, we (and some of the other golf courses in his district) were going to open back up for business. We sent out the letter yesterday that many of you received and read. Unfortunately we received word this morning that the Governor used his trump card, the Liquor Control Board. If we opened back up, we would permanently lose our liquor license.

There is a group of State Senators and Representatives fighting for golf courses to be taken off the non-essential business list. Unfortunately, we understand that golf is not an essential business when compared to many of the life sustaining businesses remaining open like grocery stores and pharmacies. However, we feel that golf remains a safe alternative for people to get outside in the fresh air, exercise and remain healthy. The Governor understands the importance of remaining active in an outside environment where many people are spread out over a large area as he has kept many of the State Parks open. We are asking for this same common-sense approach during this tough and trying time.

I don't know when we will be able to open our doors and our grounds again to the public. The one thing I know is that Quail Valley Golf Club will do everything it can to be ready to open our doors immediately when the word is given.
